About CME:

- Neuropsychiatry is an interdisciplinary field that focuses on the diagnosis, evaluation, and management of mental disorders resulting from neurological conditions. Understanding the intricate relationship between the brain and behaviour requires knowledge of both psychiatry and neurology. Disorders affecting behaviour, mood, thought, and personality fall within this growing field. Neuropsychiatrists are skilled at assessing patients with overlapping psychiatric and neurological symptoms, offering comprehensive evaluations to better understand their conditions. This integration of psychiatry and neurology has advanced the understanding of brain-behaviour connections and opened new avenues for treating mental illnesses.
- Sensitivity analyses indicate that neuropsychiatric disorders, such as depression, anxiety, and PTSD, are more prevalent in studies with a moderate risk of bias. For example, depression has a prevalence of 19.49%, anxiety 23.63%, and PTSD 36.69%. These findings highlight the need for a unified approach to address these disorders.
- The field of neuropsychiatry is advancing towards a more holistic training model, with the goal of further integrating clinical neurosciences and traditional psychiatry. This approach is crucial for understanding and treating complex medical conditions that involve both the mind and brain.
- Ayurveda, India's ancient system of medicine, has long acknowledged the significance of mental health. Classical Ayurvedic texts, such as the Sushruta Samhita and Ashtanga Hridaya, provide detailed descriptions of mental disorders, their symptoms, and treatments. Charaka Samhita also offers insights into the mind's pathology, normal personality types, and mental status examinations. Ayurvedic treatments for mental disorders include yukthivyapasraya (rational treatment), daivavyapasraya (spiritual treatment), and satvavajaya (mind control or psychotherapy).
- Ayurveda suggests that mental imbalances are caused by disturbances in the mind's rajas and tamas—factors that lead to emotional instability. These are considered the "mental doshas," while Vata, Pitta, and Kapha represent the three primary bodily doshas. Psychotherapy, or the systematic application of psychological principles, is also recognized as an important method for treating psychogenic disorders in Ayurveda.
